## Complete the following:

- 1. Camped in at least three different places as a Scout [1] for eight nights or above.
- 2. Understand how to choose an ideal camping site.
- 3. Understand the importance of proper hygiene, decency and safety of a campsite; and the ways to handle accidents.
- 4. Organize a camping activity of at least two days and one night for the Patrol, demonstrating the following items:
  - (a) pack a backpack for a two-days-one-night camping activity;
  - (b) know how to allocate the camping areas;
  - (c) use and clean the stove;
  - (d) use dangerous tools safely;
  - (e) carry and store food properly;
  - (f) ways and measures to keep the campsite hygienic and neat;
  - (g) contents and significance of the arrival inspection, night inspection, morning inspection and final inspection;
  - (h) able to utilize the knots frequently used in camping activities;
  - (i) build the following camp gadgets in the campsite: camp gate, fence, flag pole and Patrol flag, living tent, storage tent, storage rack, workstation table, camp larder, dining table, clothing and shoes racks, waste disposal facility, shelter, noticeboard
  - (j) set up, dismantle and pack at least two different types of tents;

- (k) design the menus for breakfast, lunch and dinner and cook them accordingly, including the amount of food and cooking methods; and
- (l) compile the camp plan and log.

Note: [1] Camping activity refers to overnight stays in the tent or natural shelter.



Completion of this Badge, including a total of six months or above in lecture or practicum, would be counted as an equivalent of relevant item under Skills Section of the Hong Kong Award for Young People Bronze Award.
