Complete the following:

1. (a) Understand the purpose of conservation.  
(b) Know five conservation organizations in Hong Kong.
2. (a) Have knowledge of igneous rocks, metamorphic rocks and sedimentary rocks. Give examples of each and describe their uses.  
(b) Know five different types of soil and the main reasons for soil erosion.  
(c) Understand the water cycle and its effects on wet and dry districts.  
(d) Explain the causes and effects of air and water pollution and actions that could be taken to control pollution.
3. (a) Understand the inter-relationship and dependency among plants, animals and humans for survival.  
(b) Name four examples of how human has damaged nature, two of which are near to the residence and suggest how this can be avoided.
4. Survey two outdoor locations during holidays (at least two holidays). One of the surveys should be carried out at the weekend and one of the locations should be a public area. Explain to the assessor the observations made on the following issues with the help of photographs:
  - (a) Use of land in the past and at present.
  - (b) The value of rest and recreation.
  - (c) Conservation of wildlife and plants.
  - (d) Conflicts with land users.

Note: This observation can be made with another Scout but both must submit separate reports to the assessor.

5. Participate in a conservation project organized by a conservation organization for at least one day.
